THE Income Tax department on Tuesday extended the due date for filing ITRs for **Assessment Year** (AY) 2025-26 to September 15 from July 31. Individuals and entities, who do not need to get their accounts audited, are required to file income tax returns by July 31, the Central **Board of Direct** Taxes said.

The facility is particularly intended to support the children of Corporation staff and lower income group residents

"This is such a blessing for people like us," said Lakshmi, a domestic worker from nearby locality. "I often bring my child with me when I go for work in the area. Now I can leave him in a place that is safe and fun. I never imag-



ined a government office would do something like this."

Selvam, an auto rickshaw driver who often waits outside the Corporation office for passengers, expressed similar appreciation. "My wife works as a housemaid and we have always struggled with child care. This centre gives us huge relief. It is neat, colourful, and I hope the staff would be very

The inauguration event drew many and included the participation of Anna Nagar MLA Mr. M.K. Mohan. Greater Chennai Corporation Central Zone Deputy Commissioner KJ. Praveen Kumar, IAS, and several Corporation Council members. The event featured a ribbon-cutting ceremony, a guided tour of the new facility, and interaction with the offi-

"The Greater Chennai Corporation has done something truly people-friendly," said Revathi, a roadside flower vendor. "Often, these buildings and services feel out of reach for us. But this centre is a sign that they are thinking about our children too."

Officials confirmed that trained caretakers will manage the day-today operations and that safety and hygiene standards will be strictly followed. The centre will be available for use during Corporation working hours and is expected to expand its services based on public response.


"This is not just a building—it is peace of mind for hundreds of working mothers," added Shanmugam, a sanitation worker.

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Food delivery executive arrested for sexual harassment

cross-section of residents of Anna Nagar has called for stronger safety measures and increased patrolling after a shocking incident of sexual harassment rocked the usually quiet neighbourhood. Anna Nagar Police, this past week, arrested a 24-year-old food delivery executive for allegedly sexually harassing a woman walking alone on the

According to police sources, the complainant, a 25-year-old woman residing in Anna Nagar, was returning home after visiting a friend when the incident occurred on Sixth Avenue. An unidentified man on a motorbike began following her and allegedly inappropriately touched her before fleeing the scene.

The woman, displaying courage, filed a complaint

with the Anna Nagar police the same day. Based on her account and CCTV footage from nearby shops, police traced and arrested the accused. He has been identified as Andrew John Paul, a 24-year-old native of Udumalpet in Tiruppur district. He had been working in Chennai as a food delivery executive.

Police have booked Andrew under relevant sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita and the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Harassment of Women Act. He has been remanded in judicial custody.

The incident has sparked concern and outrage among Anna Nagar residents. Many expressed shock that such an incident could occur in a wellpopulated and usually well-patrolled area.

"This is a very safe neighbourhood, or so we thought. It's frightening to know that someone can be

targeted on a busy road like Sixth Avenue," said Latha Suresh, a local resident and mother of two college-going daughters. "We need better surveillance and quicker police response in such cases."

Another resident, Arvind Kumar, said, "This is not the first time we are hearing about harassment incidents involving delivery personnel in the city. We cannot generalise, but there should be stricter background checks by companies."

Locals in the area also shared their concerns. "There are cameras outside my store, and we often see young men riding rashly at night. We should all stay more vigilant," said Ramesh, who runs a store on Sixth Avenue.

Police assured that steps are being taken to ensure the safety of women in the locality. "We are increasingly patrolling in

residential zones, especially during late evening hours. We also urge citizens to report any suspicious activity immediately," said a senior officer with the Anna Nagar Police.

The arrest has brought some sense of relief, but residents continue to demand that authorities take more proactive steps to prevent such crimes and ensure that public spaces remain safe for all.

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GCC to hire 143 data operators

THE Chennai Corporation has planned to employ security personnel for burial grounds maintained by it and to outsource 143 data entry operators for its public health wing for a year. The Greater Chennai Corporation decided to recruit 300 security personnel for the burial ground, and as per its plan, two people will be deployed per burial ground with three shifts. The GCC maintains 50 burial grounds across the city. A tender was floated for the same, and two companies which quoted the same amount were selected. The work will be split equally under the Tamil Nadu Tender Transparency Act, 1998. The salary for the security personnel has been fixed at Rs 26,695, and Rs 9.61 crore is to be spent on this recruitment.

Gulveer bags long distance double in Asian C'ship

ULVEER Singh stole the thunder at the Asian Athletics Championship in Gumi, Korea.

The Indian bagged a long distance double, winning the 5000m clocking a time of 13 minutes 24.77 seconds. Gulveer had earlier clinched the 10,000m. India have won 18 medals (eight gold,

and occupy the second spot behind China (26: 15 gold, eight silver and three bronze) at the end of the penultimate day on Friday.

Avinash Sable, who has been trying to make an impact in big events, ended India's long wait for a gold (36 years) in men's 3000m steeplechase, capturing the top spot with a time of 8:20.92.

Agasara Nandini clinched the women's heptathlon gold, scoring 5941 points. She bettered her own record (5813) by 128 points. Nandini deserves accolade for winning the gruelling event, besides emerging as the best all-

round women's athlete.

Pooja became the second Indian woman after Bobby Aloysius to win the women's high jump gold (1.89m). If the 18-year-old keeps working hard and improves constantly, Pooja



rounds still remaining, Vaishali will be looking to perform better in the coming rounds.


GIRI TRIUMPHS IN SHARJAH MASTERS



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Parking woes mount in Mogappair as vehicles occupy public roads

ESIDENTS of Mogappair are up in arms over the perennial parking menace plaguing their locality. What was once a quiet residential neighbourhood is now grappling with clogged streets, thanks to the illegal and long-term parking of heavy vehicles, including tractors and commercial transport vans.

Take the case of Ori Salai for instance. On any given day, Ori Salai and its adjoining roads are lined with an assortment of parked vehicles - some of which, locals say, have not moved in weeks. A recent visit to the area revealed even tractors and commercial vehicles are parked near residential buildings, leaving hardly any space for residents to park their personal vehicles.

"These tractors and vans don't belong to our street

residents. They are parked here by outsiders who don't have parking in their own areas," complained Mahalakshmi Ranganathan, a homemaker and long-time resident of the area. "This is not just an inconvenience - it's a safety hazard. Emergency vehicles find it hard to navigate through these narrow lanes."

Local residents allege that some of the commercial vehicles are owned by businesses operating in nearby areas, which find Mogappair's relatively le-





nient enforcement a convenient dumping ground for their fleets. With no consistent action from authorities, the problem has only

The problem isn't limited to residential discomfort. The constant obstruction also affects traffic flow. Delivery vehicles, autos, and even school vans are often forced to manoeuvre dangerously through narrow gaps. Residents also point to the lack of signage or no-parking enforcement as a contributing factor. Until then, residents of Ori Salai and other parts of Mogappair can only hope their daily struggle for space finds a resolution – before a minor inconvenience turns into a major urban crisis.
